Captain's Quiz

Did you know that you are the only person who may decide to treat your ball as unplayable? Unplayable ball relief is allowed anywhere on the course, except in a penalty area.

You may take unplayable ball relief in the "General Area" using one of three options:

1. Take relief where the previous stroke was made.
 2. Take relief by going back as far as you like on a line which keeps the spot of the original ball between you and the green.
 3. Take relief within 2 club-lengths of the spot where the original ball was, no nearer the hole. These 3 options incur a one stroke penalty.
- In a bunker: option 2 and 3 must remain in the bunker, but there is a 4th option.
4. Take relief with a two stroke penalty, using option 2 and go outside the bunker.
