Captain's Quiz

Q: If I putt and my ball goes into the hole while there is already a ball holed out and left in the hole, is this a penalty?

A: There is no penalty if you putt while another ball is still in the hole and your ball falls into the hole with it. Since the ball in the hole is no longer in play, it is a movable obstruction and there is no penalty for your ball hitting a movable obstruction.

It is a two stroke penalty if a ball in motion on the putting green hits a ball at rest and in play on the putting green.
